WHAT YOU GET

A landing page on every domain. One to one, at every tier, so every link in your outreach resolves somewhere real.

Eight inboxes per domain. Ready to send when the domain is.

WHAT THE REPORT SHOWS

Which domains are sending, warming or resting. Send volume against the agreed caps, per domain. Every replacement made, with the reason. If a domain's standing slips, you hear it from us first. Numbers on the report are measured, never estimated.

WHAT WE DO NOT PROMISE

Inbox-placement or deliverability-rate guarantees; placement is decided on networks nobody controls. We promise warmed, monitored, replaced infrastructure and honest standing reports.

PRICING

Flat by the month, cancel any time.

\$500 5 sending domains and 5 landing pages. Monitoring and domain replacement included.

\$750 12 domains and 12 landing pages, everything above, plus reply routing set up to your team.

\$1,000 24 domains and 24 landing pages, everything above, plus priority replacement and a quarterly deliverability review.

Running 25 to 100 domains is a sales call. Dedicated IP allocation above 24 domains adds \$10 per domain per month, which is what it costs us.

THE BURNED-DOMAIN WARRANTY

If a domain we manage becomes truly unrecoverable, we replace it free. Two conditions, both objective: sends stayed within the agreed caps, and the replacement warms on the standard curve.
